### 1. Background

Conservation South Africa (CSA), as a local affiliate of Conservation International (CI), is committed to helping societies adopt a more sustainable approach to development, one that considers and values nature and improves human well-being through the conservation of healthy ecosystems and the goods and services they provide.

## 2. Project Overview

Conservation South Africa (CSA) is implementing an ecosystem restoration and management project to reduce the vulnerability of targeted villages to extreme weather events such as drought, floods, fire etc. The target villages are located at the Alfred Nzo District Municipality, Bushbuckridge Local Municipality and the Namaqua District. Within this context, CSA invites all eligible bidders to provide a proposal for the CSA Social Employment Fund (SEF) project.

#### 3. Terms of Reference, Deliverables and Deliverables Schedule

Conservation South Africa is looking for consultants to provide various trainings for unskilled and skilled participants of various literacy levels. In the following topics:

- Financial Literacy
- Personal Mastery
- Emotional Intelligence
- Occupational health & safety
- Cybersecurity awareness training
- Snake handling
- Time management
- Effective communication

#### Trainings are going to be conducted in the following localities:

- 1. Umzimvubu catchment, Alfred Nzo & Joe Gqabi, Eastern Cape (13 villages see attachment 2)
- 2. Kruger to Canyons, Ehlanzeni District Municipality, Mpumalanga (15 villages see attachment 2)
- 3. Namakwa District Municipality, Northern Cape (11 villages see attachment 2)

### Upon completion of the training, the successful bidder(s) is required to deliver the following:

- Valid certificates for each participant, to be delivered no later than one 2 weeks after the completion of the training
- A training report on the training delivered submitted no later than 2 weeks after the completion of the training
- All training must be completed by 11 April 2025



Bidders may submit a proposal for one or all trainings as well as for one or all of the areas where CSA works. E.g. you may submit a proposal for personal mastery in our Namakwa District villages and not for Umzimvubu or Kruger to Canyons.

### 4. Submission Details

- a. Deadline. Proposals must be received no later than 5 March 2025 by no later than 17h00 (\$A\$T). Late submissions will not be accepted. Proposals must be submitted via email to <u>csaprocurement@conservation.org</u>. All proposals are to be submitted following the guidelines listed in this RFP.
- b. Validity of bid. 60 days from the submission deadline
- c. Clarifications. Questions may be submitted to twilson@conservation.org, kmatthews@conservation.org and csaprocurement@conservation.org by the specified date and time in the timeline below. The subject of the email must contain the RFP number. CSA will respond in writing to submitted clarifications by the date specified in the timeline below. Responses to questions that may be of common interest to all bidders will be posted to the CSA website and/or communicated via email.
- d. Amendments. At any time prior to the deadline for submission of proposals, CSA may, for any reason, modify the RFP documents by amendment which will be posted to the CSA website and/or communicated via email.

#### 5. Minimum Requirements

- a. A company profile including the experience and capacity of the applicant as well as a client list with contact details,
- b. A Valid BBEEE certificate or an Affidavit
- c. A Valid tax clearance certificate, or
- d. In the case of a sole proprietor, a comprehensive CV with details of at least 2 contactable references
- e. A price quotation for the training.
- f. Certificate of Accreditation from a Professional Body
- g. Thorough knowledge experience of the training provided
- h. Be able to travel to the villages to conduct the training and arrange own accommodation if necessary.
- i. Be able to deliver training to various literacy and numeracy levels
- j. Experience working with rural communities
- k. Be able to deliver training in the language spoken in the villages if possible.
- I. Companies or individuals responding to this RFP should be prepared to do a presentation on their service offer to the CSA selection committee.

- **7. Evaluation Criteria** In evaluating proposals, CSA will seek the best value for money considering the merits of the technical and costs proposals. Proposals will be evaluated using the following criteria:

Approach and methodology of the training provided	20%
Does the proposal cover the requirements of the RfP?	20%
Is the bidder able to facilitate the training in the vernacular of the village?	10%
Does the bidder and the proposed personnel have the specific technical expertise for the assignment?	15%
Cost: Costs proposed are reasonable and realistic, reflect a solid understanding of the assignment.	20%
Is the bidder's B-BBEE level meet CSA minimum requirements?	15%
